- **GRE Scores** 
  - Not Required
- Degree:
  - An undergraduate degree with a liberal arts foundation from a regionally accredited college or university or be in the final semester of completing their degree within the year of application
- Official transcript(s): From all colleges/universities attended
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- **Personal statement:** 
  - A personal statement for the committee to gain greater insight as to who you are, why you have chosen to pursue a graduate social work education, and your readiness for graduate work. The personal statement should be in your own words and should be 3 to 5 double-spaced type pages in length.
- References:
  - Three recommendations (at least 1-2 persons that can speak to your academics, others can be colleague, supervisor, etc.) Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended. If you completed your undergraduate degree 5 or more years ago, then you may use character references (i.e., colleagues, supervisors, etc.) for all three references. However, we strongly recommend that you attempt to secure two academic references if possible.
